1873 personally before me a pension Notary
in and for the State and County aforesaid
Jerry Scriver who, being duly sworn according
to law, declares: That he is the identical Jerry
Scriver, who enlisted under the name of Jerry
Scriver in the military service of the United
States, at the City of New York, on the 29th
day of August 1862 in Company (G) of the 70th
Regiment of New York Volunteers in the War of
1861, and was transferred into Company (G)
of the 86th Regt New York Vols, and was honor
ably discharged on the seventh day of July
1865 at McDougall, Genl Hospital N.Y. H
by reason of Telegraphic Order War Dept. May 4th
65. No 38; that his personal description is as follows:
Age 49-years height five feet Eight & one half
inches. Complexion dark - hair brown. Eyes blue
that while in the service aforesaid, and in the line
of his duty he contracted the Diarrhoea, and
Typhoid Fever - and that he was treated therefor
in the following named General Hospitals, Genl
Anger Hospital West Philadelphia Pa from
there he was sent to The Convalescent Camp ~~and~~
~~upton St.~~ above Alexandria Va - from there
to the hospital at Alexandria Va. from there

to Army Square Washington D.C., Genl
Hospital. And deponent further says that
at the time he was taken down with said
disease as aforesaid he was stationed at
Acquia Creek Va, on picket guard, and
that said complaint was brought on by exposure
and over exertion and that after he recovered
from said fever & diarrhoea he was left with
a spinal complaint which has disqualified
him from performing physical labor
and that for weeks together he has been
unable to stand upon his feet, and for
months unable to walk, and that he is
now unable to perform any hard physical
labor and but a little at any kind of labor
and that he suffers great pain through his
back and loins, whenever he attempts to labor
and that he has suffered great pain ever
since his said sickness as aforesaid. And
deponent further says that previous to said sickness
he was a strong rugged man capable of great
physical endurance, and had never been
sick or unable to perform hard & constant
labor; that he has resided since he left
the Service as aforesaid the first year thereof
in the town of Tompkins in said County of
Delaware, and the residue of the time in
the town of Sandford in the County of

Broom and State of New York, where
he now resides, and that his occupation
has been farming.

That he hereby appoints L. J. Freeman
of Detroit N.Y. his attorney to prosecute his
claim; that he has never received, or applied
for pension; that his residence is Sandford
Broom County N.Y. and his post office
address is Sherman Waymiller Pa
