Madam:

In your claim, under Act Mch. 3, 1899, for half the pension granted Jeremiah Schriver by Cert. 362,880, you are advised that the pensioner alleges that you refused to wait on him or take care of him, and that you mutually agreed to separate--you owning all the household goods; that he has, since that time, made several arrangements looking to your return, but that you have refused to accept any of them; that he has continued to support you by giving all he could spare from his pension.

The evidence indicated in the accompanying circular (3-080) should be furnished without delay, if it is your intention to further prosecute your claim. You were notified December 13, 1900, of these requirements.
